



## **Virtual VBS with Hosanna**



I am sitting down to write this before our church council meeting where we plan to discuss reopening the church. As I reflect on all the unknowns and things that could happen, I've been struggling personally with what we should do and potential impact this could have in our community if we reopen too soon. I'm a scientist and happen to work at the primate center where we are studying COVID-19, and I worry that my knowledge of the biology and complications of this disease are causing me to be exceptionally cautious in my recommendations to the council. But then I think that maybe God put me in this position for a reason. I wonder, and I question, and I worry, and then I stop and I pray. This afternoon as I looked back through the recent newsletter reports from council members I noticed a trend; we have shared the exciting improvements and renovations that have been made to the building while we have been away. It's true, the building looks terrific, and we are all excited to get back inside! And then a little song popped into my head that I haven't thought about in years, I swear that it's a God thing.

The church is not a building; the church is not a steeple; the church is not a resting place; the church is the people.

I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together!

All who follow Jesus, all around the world!

Yes, we're the church together!

If you don't have kids, it's possible that you haven't thought about this song and the accompanying hand gestures in many years so take a moment and reflect on what those words mean. We are the church. You, me, and Teresa sitting on our couches at home are the church. Right now that is the reminder I need not to rush the process of reopening the church. We can still be the church from home as we continue to serve however we are able. For some of us that may mean supporting research efforts, caring for patients, serving curbside meals, or making masks for our community, and for all of us it means protecting our neighbors by continuing to physically distance even once we come back together.

Update: The church council reflected on numerous reopening options, and I'm proud to say that we prayerfully considered our options and developed a plan and a backup plan. We will reopen our doors during Phase 2 while following physical distancing guidelines for those members who wish to come. We encourage members who are at increased risk or are able to stream the service online to continue doing so. The council will continue to work together to prepare our physical space for the gradual return of the congregation to the worship space. I want to encourage you all to reflect on what it means to serve your neighbors as a member of God's church during this strange and trying time. # Hosanna Lutheran Church Council Meeting <u>Meeting Minutes</u> April 20, 2020

The regular meeting of the Hosanna Lutheran Church Council was called to order at 7 pm on April 20, 2020 by video conference arranged by Teresa Abram.

**Those present were:** Sandy Nieto, Teresa Abram, Pastor Jay Grave, Sara Kezar, Kim Thompson, George Michell, Doug Burbank, Ashley Burbank, Steve Beene and Rob Rhea.

A quorum was established. Pastor Jay opened with devotion and prayer.

#### Goal 2020/2021: Prayerfully consider the directions Hosanna is moving to fulfill our mission:

- New building?
- Redo current building
- Move and expand preschool with satellite congregational space

Mission: To Proclaim the Love of God to all people, so they may know Jesus Christ, grow in faith and follow Christ.

Strengths: Welcoming, friendly, small groups, Exclamation, Hosanna Hot Meals, Quilters, HIS ministry, preschool

Concerns: Attendance, budget, preschool needs, building needs, technology, giving Evaluation Reports

- Pastor Report: LEARNING( about online giving, digital worship, distributed workforce, government stimulus grants), CONNECT-ING ( phone calls to members and leaders, collaborating with our neighbors, feeding our community), PLANNING ( Resurrection service, Rooted pilot program, Facebook Live in future, Sanctuary worship staffing and revamp)
- Vice President (Sara): "CARE CALLS" have been helpful, another round of calls recommended
- Worship (George): Stage is completed, carpet to be installed in a week, Facebook Live services. Suggest continue online services even after we are able to resume services in the building.
- **Discipleship (Ashley):** Small groups (encouraged to meet virtually for now), Rooted Pilot program (10 week discipleship program to replace Exploring Series 101, 201, 301, 401), Vacation Bible School (tentative dates June 22-26, may need to meet virtually due to Covid-19), Women's Retreat (postponed until fall).
- Teresa and Ashley helping Alex Abram paint fellowship hall. Recommended that carpet flooring be changed to vinyl plank flooring to match Narthex.
- **Ministry (Steve):** Hot meals providing 400-500 meals on Mondays, 300+meals by Pam on Wednesdays. Drive thru service at church, and delivery to residents without transportation. Hope to apply for grants to help supplement funding for this. Volunteers needed to provide desserts ( casserole club?)
- Fellowship (Kim): Consider Crawfish boil to-go in May, but may not be able to sell tickets since we are not meeting in person at church. Recommended waiting and holding an event, like a Reunion, when social distancing no longer needed due to Covid-19.
- Treasurer (Doug): He has the observed/budgeted figures for March. Will discuss with Rob to clarify.

**Secretary (Sandy):** Minutes to be approved. Steve motioned to approve minutes and George seconded. All were in favor, motion passed.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Cares Act update: Hosanna's application was approved for the SBA loan/grant!

Fundraising: Grant team identified (Charles Stone, Heidi Rhea, Tammy Myer), grant idea form created on CCB.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

- Research starting new preschool in Madisonville. Will recruit volunteer team to start looking into feasibility. Synod grant of \$90,000 available for startup.
- Leadership training: Teresa will help council members get better at this
- Financial Report: Doug shared Excel March figures

#### PRESIDENT'S GOALS

- Consider and decide on future of the physical spaces for preschool and fellowship/meeting areas.
- Grow ability to delegate and create excited members, teams and involvement.

**ACTION PLANS FOR COUNCIL MEMBERS: Plan goal,** 3-4 steps to take to achieve goal, evaluate % completion, prayerfully think how your purpose area can help in overall mission and goals.

#### Next Meeting will be held 5/18/2020.
